

THE LAST FURLONGS

We are down to the last two furlongs of 2017.

OK, that's a bit of a stretch, but bear with me. A "furlong" (if the term is used in anything but horse racing, I am unaware of it) is 1/8 of a mile. The Kentucky Derby is 10 furlongs (1-1/4 mile), the Preakness is 10.5 furlongs (1-3/16 miles) and the Belmont Stakes is 12 furlongs (1-1/2 mile).
